## CLASS 33

Entries will be received in the arena on Thursday from 5:30 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. and on Friday from 9:30 a.m. – 12:00 p.m. with the **exception of Art and Photography**, which will **ONLY** be received Thursday evening. No entries will be accepted after 12:00 p.m. on Friday. Judging will commence on Thursday at 8:30 p.m. for Photography and promptly at 12:30 p.m. on Friday for all other classes.

Exhibitors must show their membership card when dropping off and picking up exhibits. Entries **MUST** remain in the arena until **4:30 p.m.** on Sunday and **MUST** be picked up by **5:00 p.m.** on Sunday. Ilderton Agricultural Society's Directors (IAS) and Volunteers are **NOT** responsible for exhibits left after 5:00 p.m. on Sunday.

The seven dollar (\$7.00) IAS membership fee entitles the bearer to one admission ticket and the right to enter exhibits. **NO ENTRY FEE or IAS MEMBERSHIP** is required for Youth/Junior members (18 years of age and under) entering Youth/Junior Sections. However, if a Youth/Junior is entering an Adult/Open Section, then a membership is required and those entries **MUST** be on Adult/Open Entry Form.

Exhibitors are entitled to **ONE** entry per listed section. At the Chairperson's discretion, sections with a large number of entries may be divided. Articles in each section must be grown/completed by exhibitor since the 2019 Ilderton Fair.

Judges and committees have full power to place articles in their proper classes.

**NOTE: Please cover name on any signed entries.**

2023 IAS Membership will be deducted from all prize winnings of \$9.00 or more.

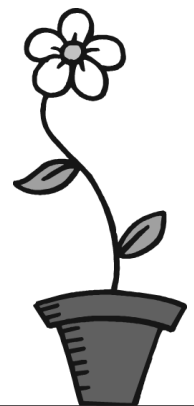
All **ADULT** and **YOUTH HOMECRAFT** and **4-H LIFESKILLS** class winners **MUST** pick up their prize winnings at the Fair Office in the arena between 1:00 p.m. on Saturday and 5:00 p.m. on Sunday.

### **RULES AND REGULATIONS:**

JUDGING IS BASED ON PUBLICATION 34, OF THE ONTARIO JUDGING AND EXHIBITING STANDARDS FOR HORTICULTURAL AND FLORAL DESIGN

1. All entries must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and HOME GROWN OR COLLECTED IN THE WILD UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED.
2. **\*\*\*All entries MUST be prepared and tagged at home, before bringing to the show. Please secure tags with tape or elastic.**
3. When judging, if a certain number is specified, there must not be either more or fewer exhibited.  
(eg: 3 blooms means 3 individual flowers, one to stem and 3 sprays means three portions of a plant with a number of flowers). If a bud shows colour it is considered a bloom. Flowering plants must be in bloom.
4. Uniform quality to count.
5. Design exhibits must be arranged by the exhibitor and must be arranged at home.
6. Measurements are STRICTLY enforced where specified.  
Be sure to measure your entry when completed, including the container.
7. Rules for judging are taken from the Horticulture Judging Standards of Ontario.  
Prizes awarded at the judge's discretion.
8. If possible, variety names should be placed on entry tags.
9. Dried arrangements may contain dried and/or preserved materials.
10. Containers must be provided by the exhibitor.
11. Professionals only enter in section designated as professional.

### Section

1. Asters, 1 stem
2. Begonia Blossom, tuberous, shown in a glass bowl, floating  
*Should not touch the sides of the container*
3. Brown Eyed Susans (Rudbeckia), perennial or annual variety, 3 blooms, single
4. Calendulas, 3 blooms
5. Chrysanthemums, 3 sprays, 1 colour
6. Chrysanthemums, 3 sprays, mixed
7. Cosmos, 3 sprays
8. Single Dahlia shown floating, in a bowl or dish, no foliage or stem  
*Should not touch the sides of the container*
9. Dahlias, not poms, 3 blooms, floating
10. Dahlias, poms, 3 blooms
11. Echinacea, 1 stem
12. Flowering shrub branch, maximum length 30 inches, (NOT in any other class, example Hydrangea)  
**(NAME IF POSSIBLE)**
13. Gaillardia, (Blanket flower), 1 stem
14. Geranium bloom with attached stem and foliage
15. Hosta, 3 leaves, same variety, no bloom.
16. Grasses, ornamental, 1 cultivar, 3 stems
17. Perennial Fern, 3 fronds
18. Hydrangea, 1 stem, any colour
19. Marigolds, 3 blooms, French type, with foliage attached
20. Marigolds, 3 blooms, African type, (large blooms) with foliage attached
21. Nasturtiums, 3 blooms, mixed colour
22. Pansies, 3 blooms, 3 individual colours
23. Pansies, 3 blooms, 1 colour
24. Petunias, 3 grandiflora (large) 3" or over, single
25. Petunias, 3 grandiflora (large) 3" or over, double
26. Petunias, 3 sprays, multiflora (small) 2 1/2" or under, single, any colour
27. Petunias, 3 sprays, multiflora (small) 2 1/2" or under, double, any colour
28. Salvia, blue, 3 spikes
29. Salvia, any other colour, 3 spikes
30. Sedum, 1 stem, maximum length of 15", including bloom
31. Snapdragons, 3 stems
32. Sunflower, seed head (size and perfection to count)
33. Any rose, 1 stem
34. Miniature rose, 1 stem with leaves
35. Rose, single bloom, other than Rugosa, shown in a bowl, no stem or foliage, floating  
*Should not touch the sides of the container*
36. Zinnias, 3 blooms, under 2"
37. Zinnias, 3 blooms, 2" and over

38. Any other flowering annual, 1 stem or spray (**NAME IF POSSIBLE, no annual that has already been listed**)
39. Any other flowering perennial, 1 stem or spray (**NAME IF POSSIBLE, no perennial that has already been listed**)
40. **SPECIAL** Exhibitor with the highest number of points in Sections 1-39 will receive a **\$25 Gift Certificate** from **Heeman's Greenhouses**.
41. **SPECIAL** Best Bloom in the Show will receive a **\$25 Gift Certificate** from **Parkway Gardens**.
42. **SPECIAL** Best Rose in the Show – open to 1 stem or 1 spray, will receive a **\$25 prize** from **Dennis Adlington, New York Fries, White Oaks Mall**. *One winner only.*

## **POTTED PLANTS**

The measurement of the pot is the diameter of the top of the container through the centre.

43. Aloe Vera, pot not to exceed 8" in diameter
44. Begonia Waxed, Busy Lizzy type, pot not to exceed 8"
45. Begonia Angel Wing, pot not to exceed 10"
46. Cactus or Succulent Collection, minimum of 3 plants, planted in a garden container
47. Single Cactus, pot not to exceed 10"
48. Single Cactus, pot not to exceed 6"
49. Coleus, pot not to exceed 10"
50. Hoya, pot not to exceed 14"
51. Impatiens, single, pot not to exceed 14" must have been grown in the pot
52. True Fern, (NOT asparagus fern) pot not to exceed 14"
53. Hanging outdoor flowering plant, pot not to exceed 16"
54. Hanging outdoor foliage plant, pot not to exceed 16"
55. Hanging indoor plant, flowering, pot not to exceed 14"
56. Hanging indoor plant, foliage, pot not to exceed 14"
57. Orchid, pot not to exceed 8"
58. Outdoor Planter or Window Box, maximum length of container 3 ft, same plant
59. Outdoor Planter or Window Box, maximum length of container 3 ft, mixed
60. Oxalis, pot not to exceed 10"
61. Peace Lily, pot not to exceed 8"
62. Topiary, not to exceed 8" pot
63. Any flowering house plant other than those named above (**NAME IF POSSIBLE**)
64. Any foliage house plant other than those named above (**NAME IF POSSIBLE**)
65. **SPECIAL** A variety of foliage houseplants, grown in a container garden.

### ARRANGING OF ENTRIES MUST BE DONE AT HOME

#### Section

70. “SUN FLOWER” – A fresh design. Using a pie plate shaped container filled with an oasis type material, design a sunflower head using other flowers. Pave like.
71. “HOLY HOSTA” – This is a fun one! Create an interesting design using the holiest Hosta leaves in your garden.
72. “GREEN LIVING ROOF” – A fresh design that could be seen on a rooftop.  
Use a rectangular container to make a green sanctuary. Accessories permitted.
73. “THREE FOR ALL” – A fresh design using only three bright colours not including greenery
74. “SIMPLE ELEGANCE” – A fresh design
75. “BEAUTY DOES NOT FADE WITH AGE” – A dried design. Accessories permitted
76. “WELCOME HOME” – A wreath for your front door. Accessories permitted.
77. “COUNTRY MUSIC” – Travel down to Nashville in your mind to get your inspiration. A fresh design.  
Accessories permitted; maybe a boot or hat.
78. “SHE SELLS SEA SHELLS” – A dried miniature design in a shell. Size not to exceed 2" in any direction, including the container.
79. “MY WINTER GARDEN” – A fresh design, using plant material that lasts through winter. Possible examples, sedum or dogwood.

**The next section is for those who have never entered in the flower show before.**

80. "FOR THE FIRST TIME, A GLASS OF WINE" – A fresh design in a wine glass.

**The next four sections can be for those who may not grow their own flowers. Commercial material is permitted**

81. “BOLD CHOICES” – A fresh design. Use your imagination.
82. “FAMILY TIES” – A design using several containers. Each container may hold a complete or partial design, but combined they make a unified whole, similar to the members of your family. Accessories permitted
83. “LINE DANCE” – Using one container, create a fresh design showing three levels of plants in a row
84. “MY FOYER” – Create an amazing dried design which will sit on the floor in your foyer.
85. SPECIAL “VILLAGE TEA POT” – A fresh design in a tea cup. Invite your friends for a spot of tea. **\$25 prize** donated by **The Village Teapot, Ilderton**. Accessories permitted.
86. **BONUS SPECIAL** – “SPOOKTACULAR” – A dried design. Ready for Hallowe'en??? **\$75 prize** donated by **Dennis Adlington, New York Fries, White Oaks Mall**. *One winner only.*
